




Another victim of these inhumane acts

Q & A



Through a friend of a friend, we found Helen Barbara, a 46 year old psychic medium who agreed to share the secrets of how these 'mind games' are played. To her clients, Helen appears as a gifted clairvoyant who has been practicing dark arts for almost 18 years and whose grandmother possessed the "second sight". She, however, confessed that her art was a mixture of social media research, clever decoration, and sizing people up, or in her own words, 'a scam'. She gave us an exclusive tour of the 'room' where her clients come and the setting is far more low-key than we expected. There's a vague odor of stained carpets and school lunch halls giving it a very chaotic but mystic aura. Yet, despite the apparent mess, every item has its place.

How much do you charge for a reading?

"18 years ago, I started with \$30 per reading. Now it varies but on average one reading can cost you thousands of dollars but then you get a 10% discount if you book at least five follow up meetings. I charge the most from people who want to communicate with a dead loved one because they're so desperate and would agree to anything."

How come you know some personal details about your clients or in your own words 'research'? How is it done?

"More often than not, the person coming for the reading does most of the work themselves. If I make some vague comment about getting hurt in a previous relationship, they make the connection to an evil ex." As for the research, I tell them I need their IDs so I can send directions to my house, but every now and again, I do a little study.
